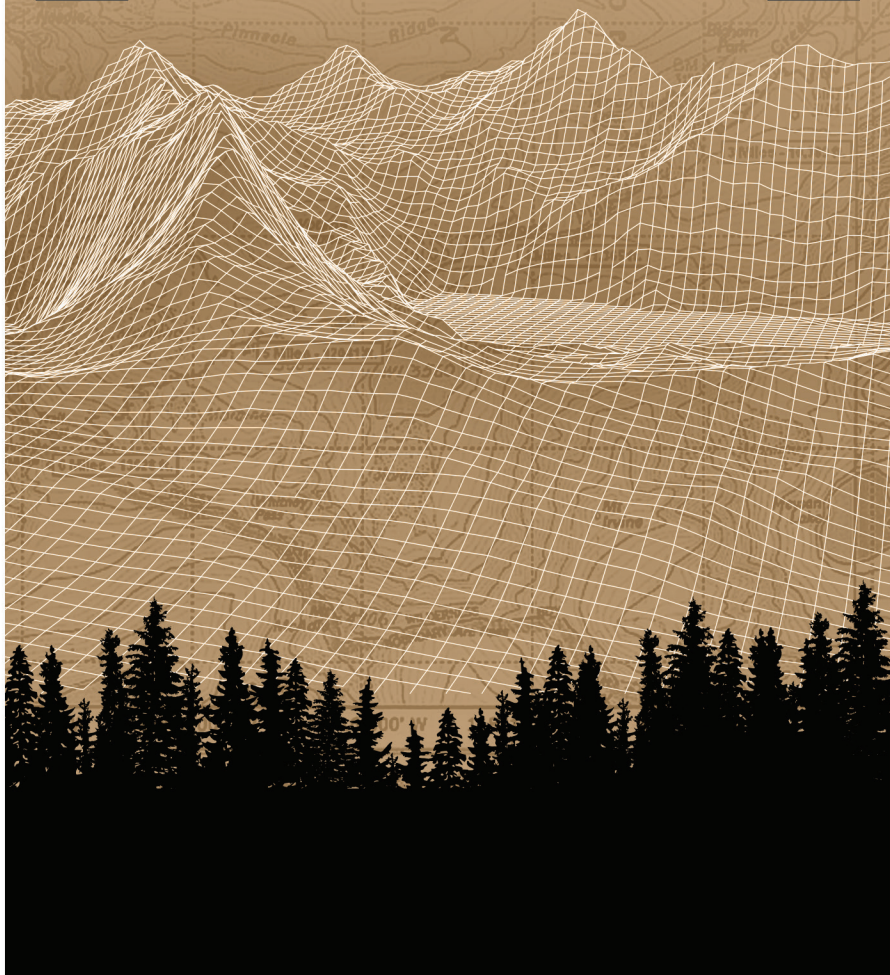
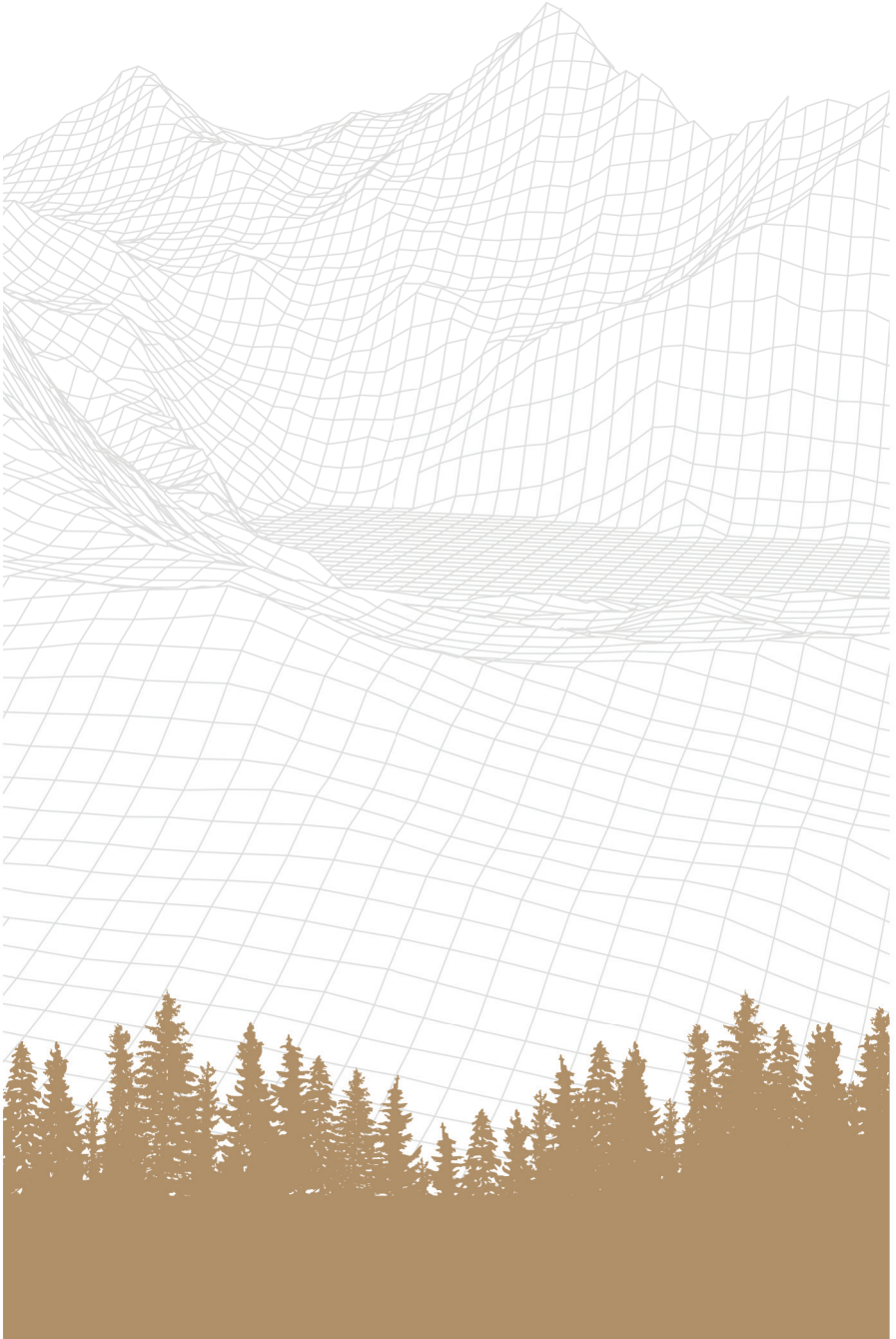

2. **Read Acts 9:1-22, 31.** What was the result of Paul's conversion from killing Christians to proving Jesus was Messiah?

GALATIANS: JESUS CAME TO SET US FREE

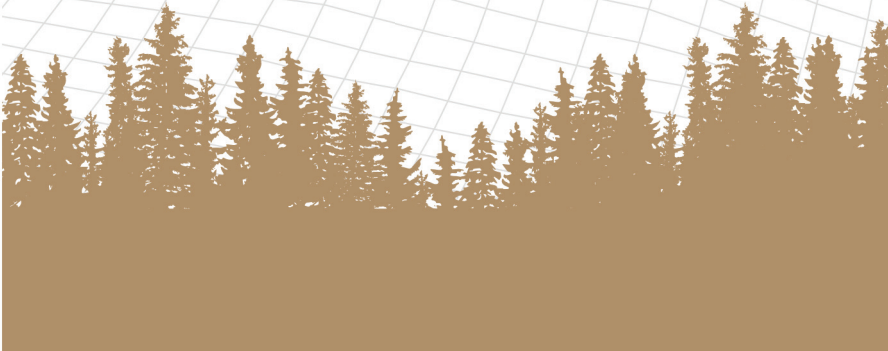
3. As a result of the persecution, Christians were scattered all over the known world. Paul planted churches all the way from Jerusalem to Rome.

0	Born in Tarsus, A.D. 10 (Acts 22:3)
20	Crucifixion of Jesus A.D. 29-30
24	Stoning of Stephen/Damascus Road (Paul's Salvation), Silent years A.D. 37-46
36	First Missionary Journey A.D. 46-47
38	Jerusalem Conference A.D. 48-49 (Acts 15)
40	Second Missionary Journey A.D. 50-52, 1 & 2 Thessalonians
43	Third Missionary Journey A.D. 53-57
47	Trip to Jerusalem with Offering, 2 Corinthians, Romans
47	Arrest and Imprisonment (2 yrs) A.D. 57-59, Trip to Rome as prisoner
50	First Roman Imprisonment A.D. 60-62, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, Philemon
54	Released from prison A.D. 63-65, 1 Timothy, Titus
57	Final imprisonment and martyrdom A.D. 66-67, 2 Timothy

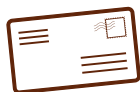

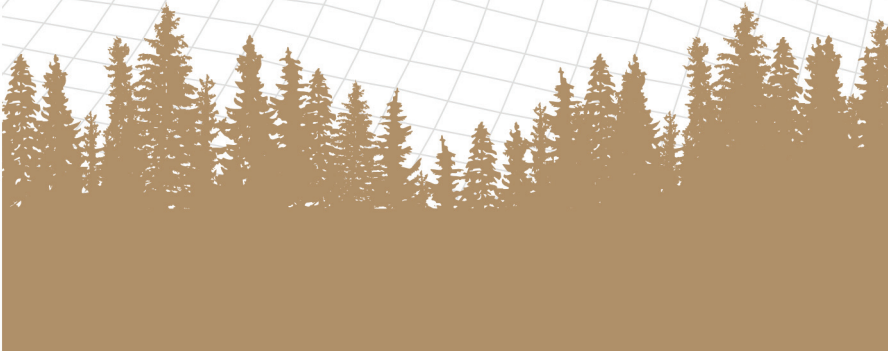

6. Paul also wrote letters to other leaders, and other leaders wrote their own letters. (See the list above). Read Philemon 15-20. Philemon was a slave owner, whose slave, Onesimus became a believer and then ran away. What was Paul's request to him? How difficult would it have been in that culture to embrace these new Christian values? When do you find it difficult to embrace Christian values in our culture?

7. Paul wrote to Timothy, a young leader in the church about a new purpose in life. Read 1 Timothy 1:12-17. What does Paul say about himself? What was his new purpose in life?

8. In 2 Timothy 4, Paul instructs Timothy on his new purpose in life. These words could apply to us. Read these words aloud, and put your "own name in blanks." How does this affect your sense of your purpose in life?



In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you, _____, this charge: Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction. But you, _____, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry. (2 Timothy 4:1-2)

9. As John writes his first letter to the churches, 1 John, he spells out 7 things we are encouraged to do as believers. Read each reference and jot down what we should do:

10. In these early days of the church, there were false teachers who circulated and got connected into these new young churches. There are many warnings about them in these letters. False teaching brings up the challenge of knowing how to balance love and a commitment to the truth. Jude, another half-brother of Jesus, wrote about it as well as John. **Read Jude 4.** What is the breach of truth he describes? How does he suggest they balance that with love in verse 20-22? **Read 2 John 1-3.** How does he describe this balance? How does



John suggest they balance love and truth in verses 7,10,11? Do you think this is necessary today?
